Dear Friends,

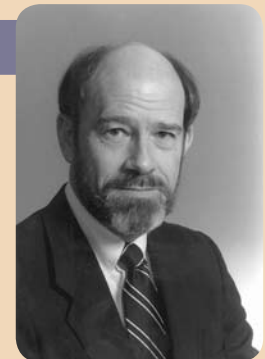

# Capital Campaign

## Capital campaign extension of *Community Partners Building for the Future* brings over \$800,000 to CCC

Looking back, it is amazing to see what can be accomplished so quickly. On August 15, 2005 the College received a letter from SUNY telling us that additional matching funds for capital projects were now available. The catch was that we only had 30 days to secure any gifts or pledges!

The ball started rolling with a pledge from the ACC/CCC Alumni Association. With this in hand, we set an ambitious (we thought!) goal of \$75,000 and requested that amount from SUNY. Our next pledge came from the D. E. French and Stanley W. Metcalf Foundations. Soon the Columbian, Allyn and Samuel and Bertha Schwartz Foundations joined in, followed a few days later by Nucor Steel Auburn. We had surpassed our \$75,000 goal, which would earn an additional \$75,000 through SUNY! A while later, a grant from the Howard Green Foundation took us even further.

And then it happened. First we received confirmation of a gift of \$100,000 from Follett Higher Education Group, which operates the CCC Bookstore. At about the same time, we informed the Stardust Foundation of these potential matching funds. Within days, we had not an answer but a question: Would SUNY increase their match beyond \$75,000 to \$400,000? SUNY's answer was yes, and with that the Stardust Foundation pledged \$250,000 for the renovations of the College Theatre at Cayuga Community College.

All told, we eventually secured \$438,000 from our generous donors. With the pledge from the SUNY Construction Fund, a total of \$838,000 was made available for the theatre renovations, the Cayuga Café and other projects at the College.

On behalf of Cayuga Community College and our students, we thank all of these friends, old and new, who made the 2005 Capital Campaign extension the most exciting 30 days in the Foundation's history!

## CCC Renovates, Rededicates Theatre Thanks to The Stardust Foundation

In 2006 the theatre at Cayuga Community College began its first major facelift since its opening in 1958. In recognition of a \$250,000 grant from the Stardust Foundation of Scottsdale, Arizona, the CCC Theatre will reopen in early 2007 as the *Irene A. Bisgrove Community Theatre*.

Auburn native Jerry Bisgrove ran the Red Star Trucking Company for many years with his brother Jack. Red Star was founded by their father John Bisgrove Sr. in 1932 and grew into a national trucking company with terminals in the Northeast. Irene A. Bisgrove was the wife of John Bisgrove Sr. and mother to Jerry and Jack.

"Throughout their years in business, our parents were always dedicated to the Auburn community and especially to Red Star's employees," said Jack Bisgrove. "The naming of the Irene A. Bisgrove Community Theatre will continue our family's legacy of helping to make Auburn a better place to live, work and raise a family."

The grant from the Stardust Foundation helped support major renovations, including larger, more comfortable seating; wider aisles; expanded spaces for wheelchairs and companion seating; and 100 Internet-ready "E-Seats" for online lectures and conferences.

Additional support for the renovation projects was forthcoming from the John Ben Snow Foundation of Syracuse which paid for accessibility features for patrons in wheelchairs or with other disabilities. The Institute for the Application of Geospatial Technology (IAGT) at the College provided funds for technology infrastructure to make the theatre usable for educational meetings and conferences.

# Support to the College

The Foundation provides support to the College in two forms: 1) scholarships, awards and grants to students and 2) support for academic and other College and community programs. Much of the Foundation's annual support is dependent upon the state of the economy in general. The amount of money annually generated from endowed funds and other foundations are determined by the rise or fall of investment portfolios.

## SUPPORT TO STUDENTS

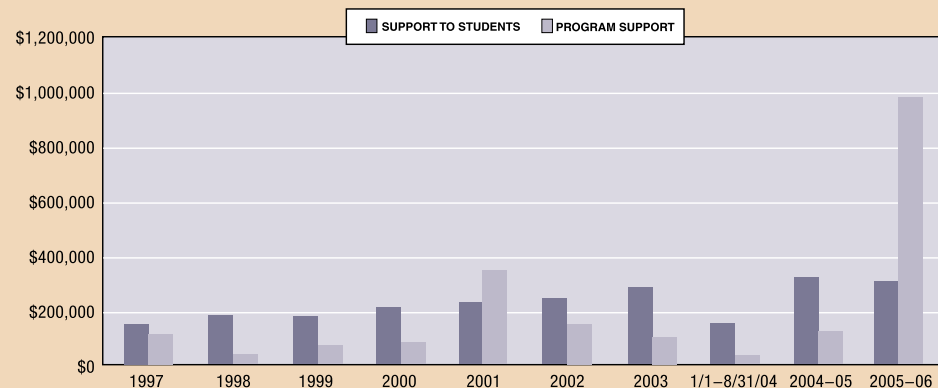
*Several new scholarships and commencement awards were created in this fiscal year.*

- Mr. Robert Foresman created **The Foresman Family Scholarship** while his father Arthur was serving as a Director of the Foundation. This scholarship will be awarded to an Auburn High School senior with a good grade point average who demonstrates financial need.
- The estate of **Dorothy and Harry George** announced a gift to the college to be distributed annually to fund instructional equipment, scholarships and commencement awards.

*In addition, the Foundation also provided:*

- \$312,114 in scholarships and commencement awards to help defray over \$4 million in unmet student need.
- \$93,800 in generous annual donations from foundations, including the Allyn Foundation, the Frances C. and Albert C. Knight Foundation, Stanley W. Metcalf Foundation, D. E. French Foundation, Columbian Foundation, and Samuel and Bertha Schwartz Foundation. Further support came from alumni, faculty, staff, businesses, organizations, trusts and memorial gifts.

# Support to the College

## PROGRAM SUPPORT

Program Support to Faculty, Staff, and our community:

- **Instructional Equipment** was provided from two endowed funds in the amount of \$39,468 to complete upgrading to a digital transmitter for the Telecommunications program, upgrade equipment to the nursing lab, and replace exercise and weight equipment in the Fitness Center. This funding supplements the technology fee charged to each student and assures state of the art equipment for the students.
- The **Library Collection Fund** made it possible for the library to purchase \$935 in new books with the majority being encyclopedias.
- **Cultural Events** are annually made possible by the Foundation through the Noreen and Michael J. Falcone lecture series, the Cultural Enrichment Fund and the Ruth P. Thomas Arts Fund.
- In the fall, Leslie Heywood lectured on Hardbody Panic, Body Ideals in "Fight Club," the Mass Media and Your Local Gym. Leslie attracted a sizeable audience of all ages to this free event. Dr. Heywood is a professor of English and creative writing at SUNY Binghamton, an author, bodybuilder, power lifter, mother and former track and cross-country runner.

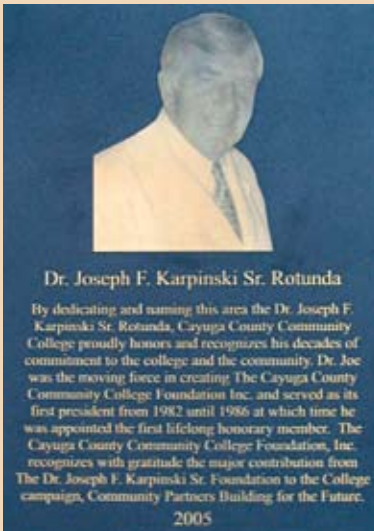
- Spring on campus sprung with a performance by the a cappella quintet, Sons of Pitches, who have spectacular harmony and superstar showmanship. This group has performed all over the country, including appearances with Hootie and the Blowfish and the 2000 USA Olympic Team. The free admission performance drew a large crowd to the College Theatre.
- The **Program Initiative Fund** was awarded to Peter Liddell, Director of Athletics, to create an intercollegiate athletic program academic profile. This will show academic performance of team participants, grade point averages and overall academic status. This new tool will be most helpful to the student athletes but also to the College in monitoring the educational success of the athletes and their retention.
- **Development and Special Project Grants** provided opportunities for faculty and staff members to attend conferences and classes that will improve their skills and benefit students and staff. This year's recipients were: Brenda Holland, Director of Business Services/ Comptroller, attended a conference for users of Banner software; Linda Alfieri, Professor of Nursing, attended the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission's Self-Study Forum; nursing faculty Linda MacKay, Linda Alfieri and Brenda Forrest attended a conference on building Effective Clinical Evaluation Tools in Nursing; and Abu Badruddin, GIS Associate Professor, attended ESRI training on Cartography with ArcGIS. One Summer Faculty Fellowship was awarded to Patricia Gridley, Associate Professor of Early Childhood, to gather data required for the self-study phase of the accreditation process for the Early Childhood Program. All attendees submit written reports to the Foundation and explain what the grant provided.

## CCCC FOUNDATION

- On Wednesday, September 28, 2005, the Cayuga County Community College Foundation honored Dr. Joseph F. Karpinski Sr., Auburn's well-known retired oral surgeon and philanthropist. The central area of the James T. Walsh Regional Economic Center was dedicated as the "Dr. Joseph F. Karpinski Sr. Rotunda" in his honor. This event attracted many friends, family members, College officials and local dignitaries and featured speeches by College President Dr. Dennis Golladay and Foundation President Robert Pine.



Dr. Golladay thanked Dr. Karpinski for his decades of commitment to the College and the community. "Dr. Joe" was instrumental in creating the Foundation in 1982 and served as its first President from 1982-86. Following his service, he was unanimously appointed as a lifetime Honorary Director of the Foundation. Dr. Golladay also noted that a member of the Karpinski family has served on the Board of Trustees since the College's inception.

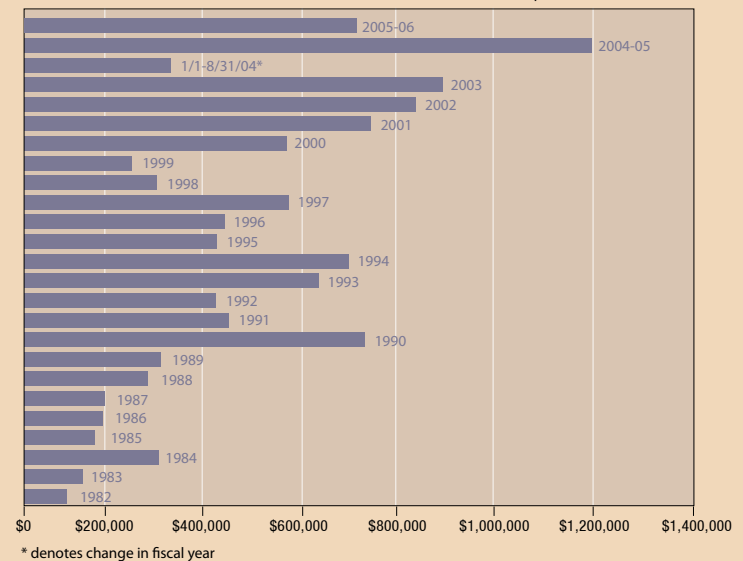

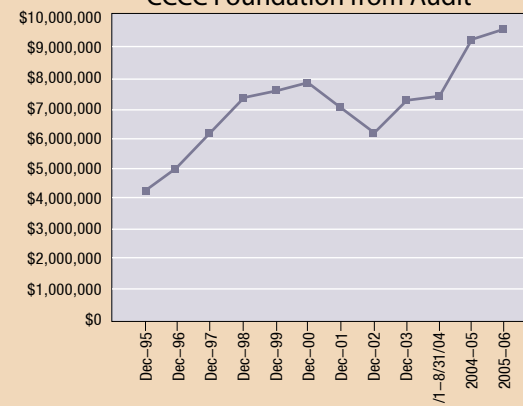
- The Foundation Board of Directors met on the Fulton Campus in October and hosted a donor recognition reception for those who helped raise \$182,000 for technology and equipment.
