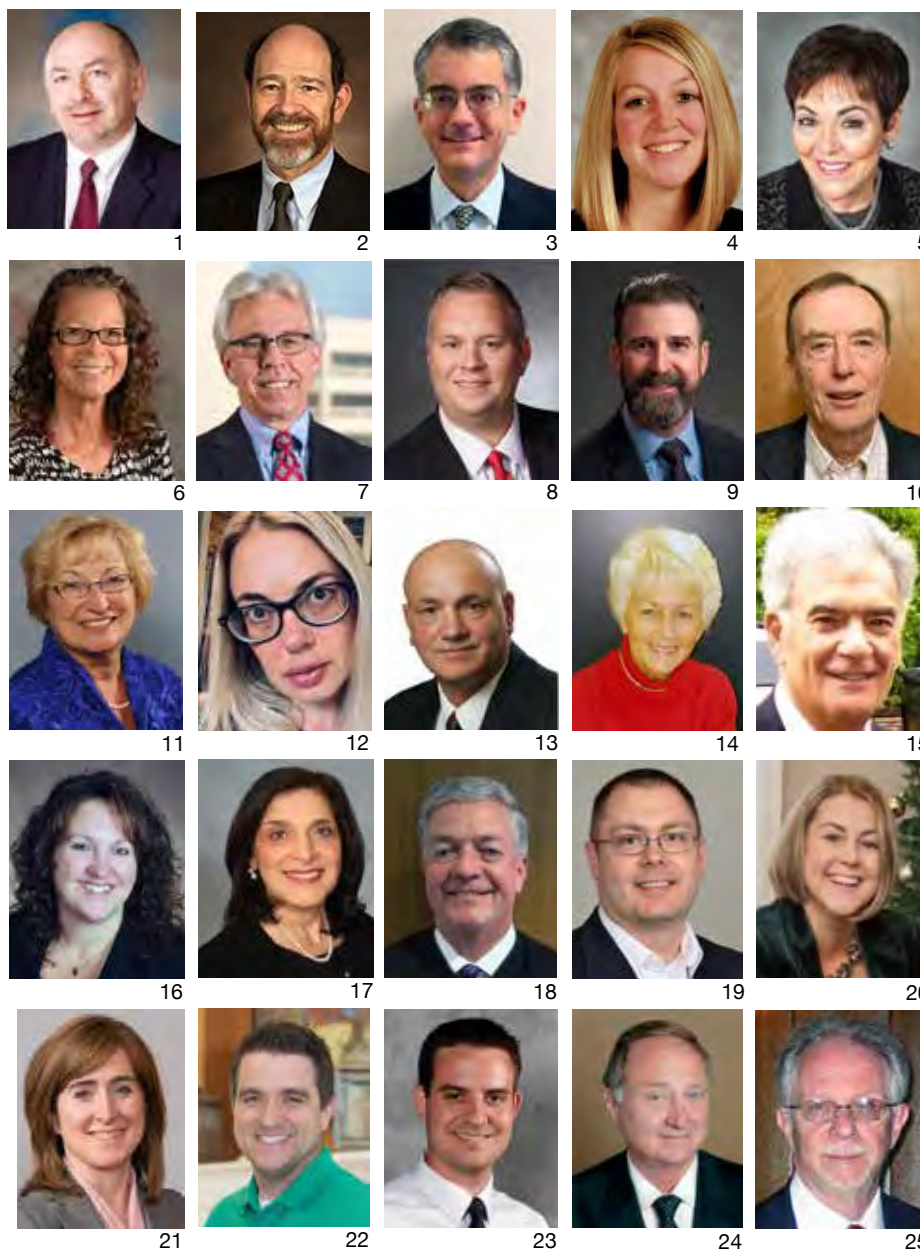

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends and Supporters,

The Cayuga County Community College Foundation celebrated the 40th Anniversary of its founding on several fronts, from supporting the College in its effort to increase enrollment and help students get a degree to facilitating capital improvements.

In June the College Foundation looked at several programs presented by the College's President, Dr. Brian M. Durant, and his staff for funding. The Foundation Board unanimously approved funding for the following:

- A two year commitment of \$10,000 each year starting in the Summer of 2023 to fund a pilot program for students in the Employment Opportunities Program. Part of the Summer Bridge Program, funding will be used for a course to help with the transition to their first semester and focus on skill development in Math and English.
- Expanded our Presidential Scholar Program to help recruit students for the 2023-2024 Academic Year to include up to \$500 per semester for students who qualify as Presidential Scholars and are fully covered by Pell and/or TAP.
- Created a "Celebration Award" for Auburn Enlarged School District students who enroll full time after earning their GED at Cayuga Community College with \$500 each semester for up to 2 semesters to encourage them to pursue a degree from Cayuga.

The College Foundation facilitated honoring of long time Theater Director, Bob Frame, with the naming of The Bob Frame Black Box Theatre, through a multi-year gift from his son, **Michael Frame '99**.

The Foundation has also started a multi-year commitment of more than \$215,000 to assist the College fund the creation of a Law Enforcement Academy in Fulton supported by the Oswego County Legislature.

As we head into 2024, the Foundation is thankful for our long standing donor support and welcome those who want to invest in the future of Cayuga.

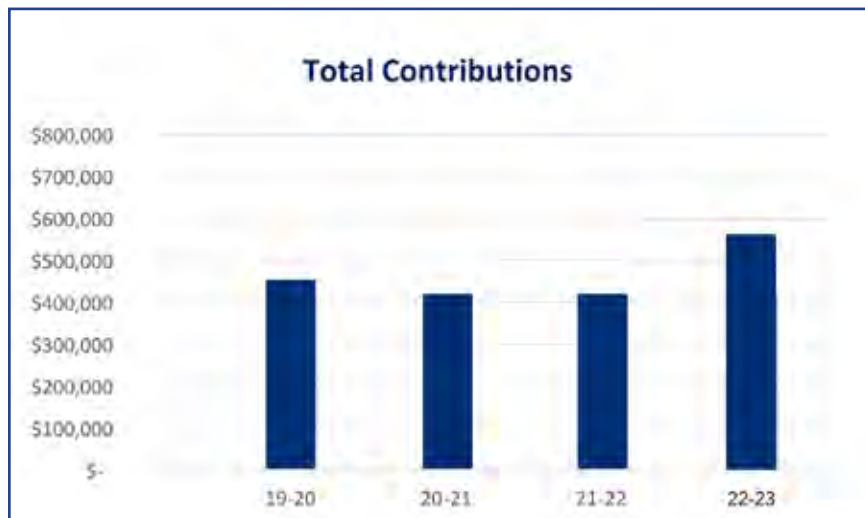
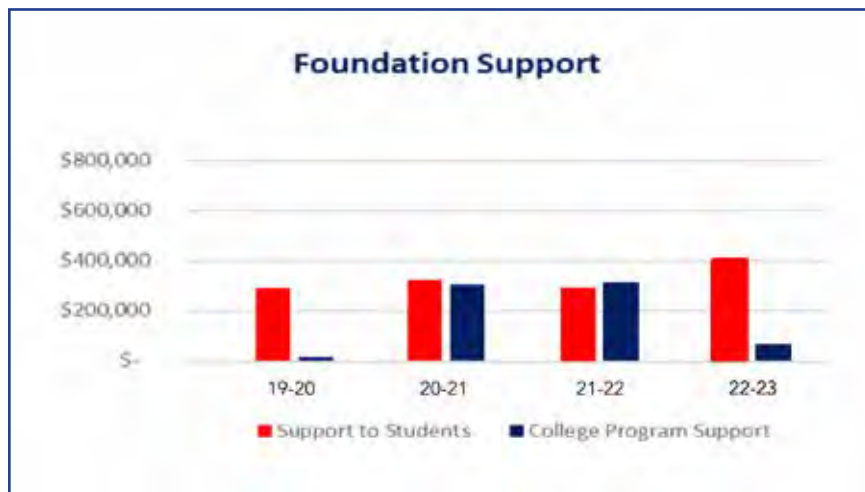

It was only fitting after having been a part of more than 100 productions in the Black Box Theatre at Cayuga Community College, that it would be named after long time Professor and Theatre Director Bob Frame. Through a generous, multi-year gift from his son, **Michael Frame '99**, the Bob Frame Black Box Theatre became a reality on March 18th, 2023.

Joined by more than 100 friends and current and past colleagues, Bob Frame was honored by his son and the Foundation at a reception catered by Scratch Farmhouse, owned by **Luke Szabo '15**, before a production of *“Odd Jobs: Cosmic Work and Cosmic Wonders”* in the Irene A. Bisgrove Theatre.

Bob Frame came to Cayuga after graduating with a Bachelor of Arts Degree from SUNY Oswego in 1979. Foundation Ex Officio Board Member Dan Labeille, who hired him, told those assembled at the pre-performance reception why he was the right fit for Cayuga in a theatre program that has only thrived under his leadership. In his long and distinguished career at Cayuga he had been a driving force in making sure that theatre productions were accessible and varied for the greater Cayuga community. The posters of many of those productions line the hallway near the new Bob Frame Black Box Theatre.

Steve Keeler, who recently retired as the Division Chair of the Humanities/Communications School of Music and the Arts (SOMA) talked about Bob Frame’s dedication and also his award winning works. He and his productions are regularly recognized by the Theatre Association of New York (TANY’s).

During his distinguished 50+ year career Bob Frame has received numerous awards for his work from local, state and national organizations. They have included The Mary Eva Duthie Award for outstanding contribution to New York State Community Theatre and, in 2012, a SUNY Chancellor’s Award for Excellence in Professional Service.

In 2020, he was recognized as a Fellow of American Association of Community Theatre. The designation “AACT Fellow” is bestowed upon members of AACT who, over a

period of years, have contributed significantly to the idea and ideal of community theatre, and to AACT.

He has shared his passion for theatre with 100’s - if not 1000’s. Many of those in attendance at the reception had either taken classes from Bob Frame and/or been in productions, including TANY’s competitions.

While after 42 years he retired as Director of Theatre Operations at Cayuga, he continues to teach theatre courses and direct original works for Harlequin Productions. It was noted at the event by College Foundation President John Latanyshyn, that “... he has served as the Technical Director for the TANY’s Festival for over 20 years, coordinating the backstage mayhem, while as many as 8 shows are performed over the course of one weekend.”

He and the late Dick Mahlstedt, a Cayuga Professor, were instrumental in bringing the annual statewide festival to Cayuga, where it stayed for many years. Bob Frame has served as a respected roving and technical adjudicator for TANYs, in addition to serving as a past president. He has also served as technical director, overseeing the construction of the scenery for productions ranging from three simple benches to a full three-story set.

Bob Frame has loaded innumerable plays and concerts onto various stages in Central New York while working as a professional stagehand and spent many years in the Syracuse Opera scene shop.

Ed Sayles, the long time Producing Director of the Merry-Go-Round Playhouse and good friend of Bob Frame, talked about their collaborations over the years to those assembled. Mr. Frame has designed lights for almost every genre of performance during his lifetime and in every incarnation of the theatre; from high school and higher ed, to community theatre and professional stages.

Michael Frame told those in attendance why he wanted to have his father recognized at Cayuga. He also pointed out that he and his sisters are all proud Cayuga grads – one of whom, Caryl, watched the presentations in South Korea as it was live streamed.

The pre-performance program included a resolution presented by Cayuga County Legislator and College Trustee **Trisha Kerr '96** from the Cayuga County Legislature recognizing March 18th as “Bob Frame Day In Cayuga County”.

Before the ribbon cutting and dedication, Cayuga President Dr. Brian Durant thanked Bob Frame for his service to the College and Michael Frame for his generous philanthropic gift.

Those in attendance were told by Bob Frame, during his curtain speech before the performance, “this evening has been such a thrill. I cannot say a dream-come-true because this recognition isn’t anything that ever entered my mind. I was just a guy doing his job.” He finished his remarks by thanking his son Michael for the “... very special honor ...” and that he truly appreciated his son’s thoughtfulness.

FOUNDATION FUNDS PILOT EOP

The Cayuga Community College Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) was initially established at the College in the summer of 2022, and has been providing access and opportunity for New York State students who demonstrate academic potential and a desire to earn a college degree. The program assists students who are both (historically) academically and financially disadvantaged. In the Spring of 2023, after hearing a presentation from Debra Joseph-McKeon (pictured), Director of the Education Opportunity Program, the Foundation Board unanimously agreed to fund a multi-year pilot program to support Cayuga's EOP.



In the summer of 2023, EOP facilitated a 4-week summer program. The experience comprised of a College Success Strategies component, English/Writing component, Math Component, and with the support of the Foundation, a 1-credit CS035 Computer Literacy component, facilitated by **Prof. Loraine Miller '73**. Of the five summer program participants, four successfully completed. Currently, EOP serves 12 students of Cayuga Community College and is continuing in its efforts to meet student enrollment goals, and to expand its student-centered services/support and programming tailored to meet the needs of its students, in support of their academic success.

CAYUGA PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS

The Cayuga Presidential Scholarship are for outstanding students from high schools in Cayuga and Oswego counties, including private schools. Students from the Jordan-Elbridge, Skaneateles and Red Creek school districts are also eligible. This honor is available to all students who graduate in the top 20% of their high school as long as the student maintains a 3.0 GPA and attends full time. All Cayuga Presidential Scholarship recipients can complete the first two years of their college education without spending a dime in tuition.

The Cayuga Presidential Scholarships reward students who participate in honors programs, student government and other leadership positions. These students serve to raise the academic bar in every classroom, serving as examples for their peers.

The Foundation Board Expanded our Presidential Scholar Program to help recruit students for the 2023-2024 Academic Year to include up to \$500 per semester for students who qualify as Presidential Scholars and are fully covered by Pell and/or TAP.
