## Degree requirements

State University of New York General Education requirements must be met before the Associate in Arts degree will be granted. The course of study leading to this degree should be an organized curriculum composed primarily of courses in the Liberal Arts and Sciences. A minimum of 62 credits, but fewer than 120 credits, are required, with an average grade of C (2.000). Some courses are only offered during the day.

## Concentrations

For enhanced career and transfer opportunities, Cayuga offers concentrations in:

**Criminal Justice, Early Childhood Education, Literature, Psychology, Theatre and Writing.**

Concentrations are not majors and are not required to earn the Liberal Arts / Humanities and Social Science degree. Consult with an academic adviser before scheduling courses for a concentration.

## Transfer opportunities

Cayuga Liberal Arts graduates have successfully transferred to a wide variety of SUNY and private institutions to complete baccalaureate and graduate programs in their fields of interest. Consult early with the Cayuga transfer counselor to assure maximum applicability of Cayuga course credit to your prospective upper-level school.
