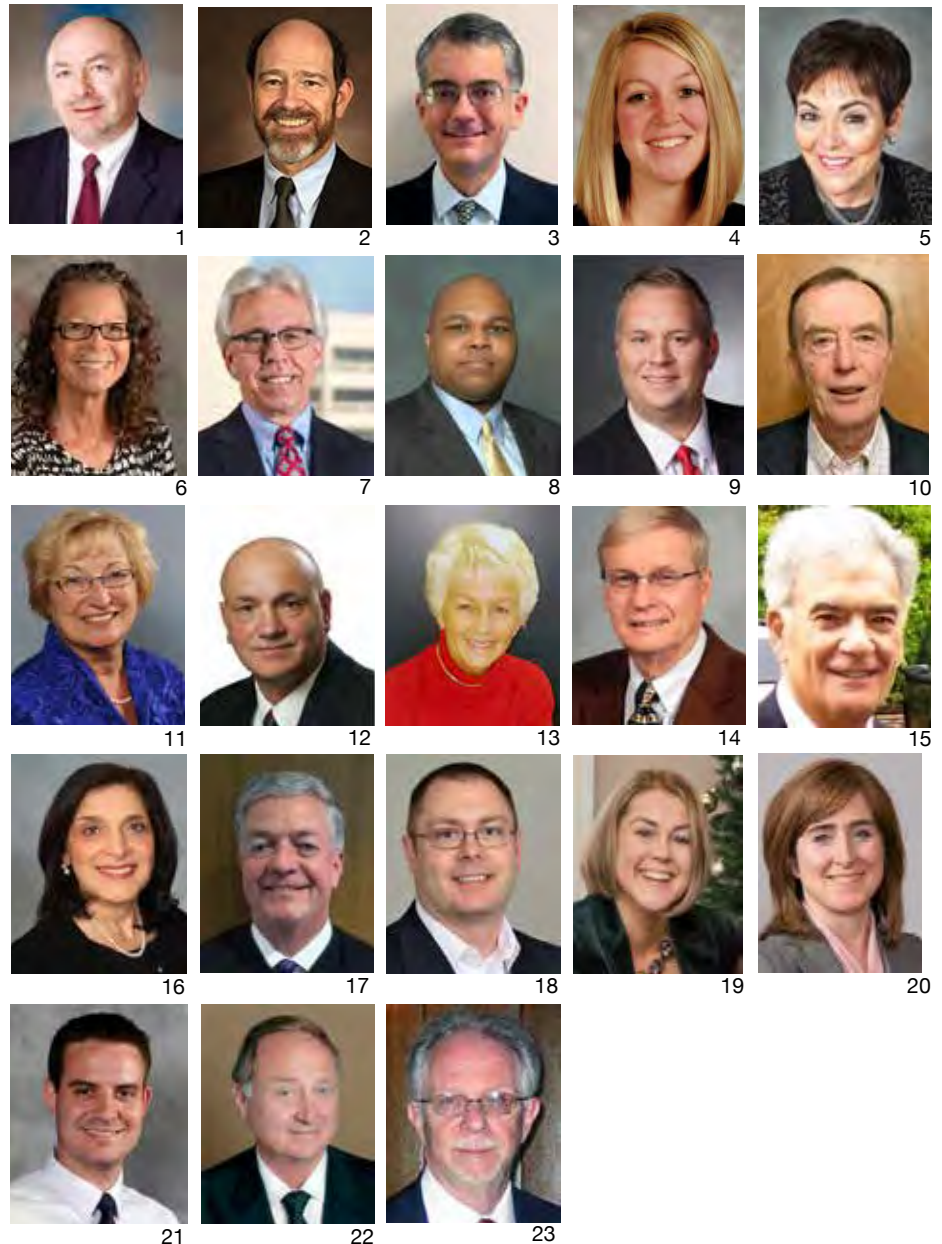

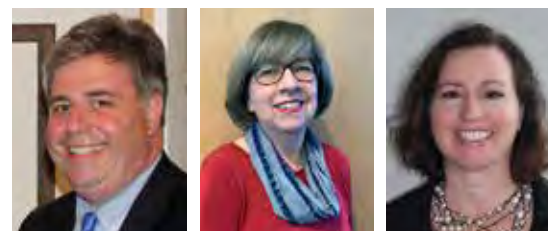

## A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends and Supporters,

This year marks the 40th Anniversary of the founding of the Cayuga County Community College Foundation. A small group of forward thinking leaders from the College and our community came together in 1982 to see if there was a way to make long term investments in what is clearly a jewel in our community, Cayuga Community College.

From a small initial corpus of \$1,572 we are proud to report that the Foundation ended our 2021-2022 Fiscal Year with an endowment balance of nearly \$17 million, even after a large market slide in the first three quarters of 2022.

As you will read in this Annual Report, we have continued to invest in our students, our faculty and staff, and our facilities (the newly opened Advanced Manufacturing Institute in Fulton, funded with Foundation support is profiled in these pages). Just as importantly, we have increased our disbursement rate for scholarships to allow greater funding for our students and expanded our Presidential Scholarship by 50% in the 2021-2022 Academic Year to recruit students to Cayuga.

The seeds planted in 1982 have resulted in four decades of investment in Cayuga with the assistance of our alumni, donors and local supporters and philanthropic community to give our students a host of opportunities to learn and grow, whether it be in one of our degree programs or in the area of workforce development.

As we head into 2023, the Foundation has emerged into a post pandemic world ever thankful for our long standing donor support and welcoming those who want to “invest” in Cayuga, knowing that it is a great investment. Several of those “investors” are featured throughout this report.

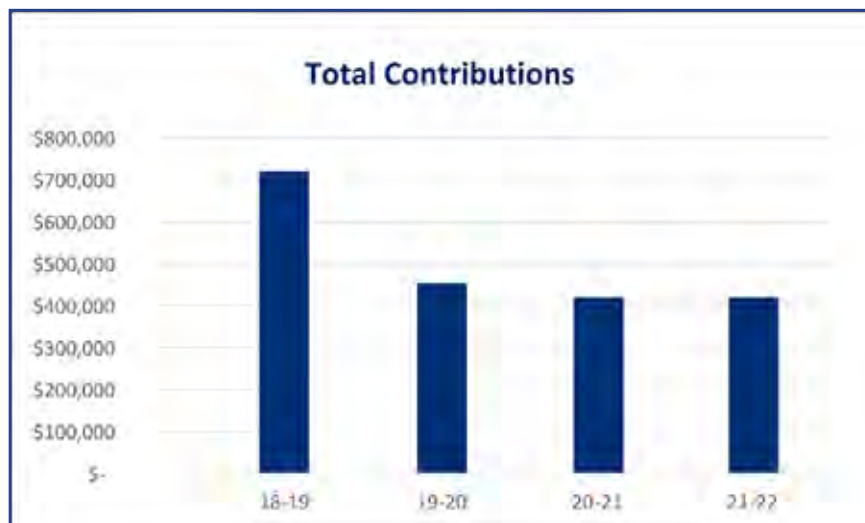
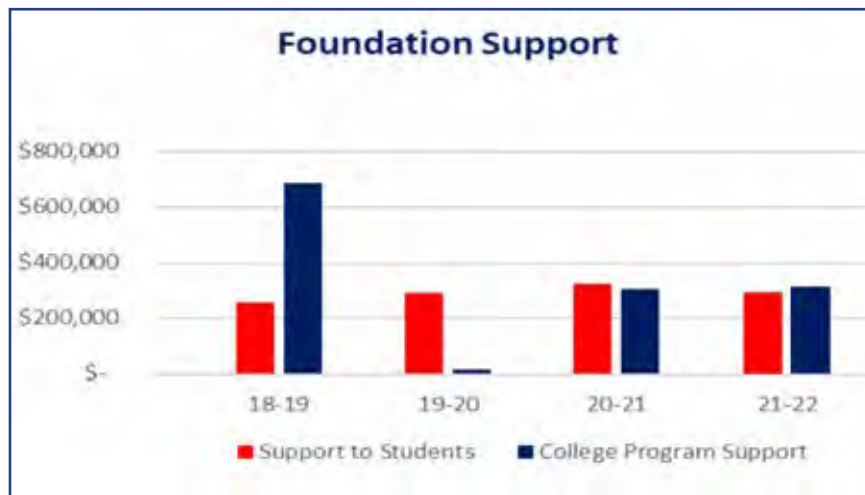

Welcoming the first class in 2021, Cayuga's Culinary Arts Program combines classroom instruction and hands-on training to master food preparation, presentation, and menu design. Students practice their skills in the state-of-the-art Culinary Institute and must complete internships to prepare for the next step in their career and earn a Degree.

## **CAYUGA COUNTY REALTOR® ASSOCIATION SUPPORTS CAYUGA STUDENT EMERGENCY FUND, NEW SCHOLARSHIP**

A generous donation was made by the Cayuga County Chapter of the Greater Syracuse Association of REALTOR's on behalf of the past members of the Cayuga County Association of REALTORS. That will support two key student-focused initiatives at Cayuga Community College and closed out the Foundation's Student Emergency Fund Challenge Grant created last Fall, surpassing the goal of the Foundation.



The \$40,000 gift from the REALTOR Association was divided between the Foundation's Student Emergency Fund Challenge Grant and the creation of a new scholarship, the Cayuga County Realtors Scholarship, established to support business students attending Cayuga.

Midge Fricano, Past President of Cayuga County Association of REALTORS and Lynnore Fetyko, Chief Executive Officer of Greater Syracuse Association of REALTORS, (pictured with Cayuga Community College President Dr. Brian Durant and Foundation Executive Director Guy Thomas Cosentino), worked on this scholarship donation with the College's Foundation. Ms. Fricano said "our members are focused on supporting local community initiatives for higher education programs that promote quality of life for future generations."

The Foundation's Challenge Grant was created to help students overcome difficulties to continue their studies. Students are able to request support from the Student Emergency Fund through an application process that includes an evaluation of the request by College personnel for one-time expenses that might arise in food security, housing, medical or transportation issues that may prevent a student from continuing at Cayuga.

"We are so appreciative of the support of the Cayuga County Association of REALTOR® through the Greater Syracuse Association of REALTOR's ® for Cayuga and its students, both for those who want to get a degree, and those who might have an unanticipated emergency

need," said the Foundation's Executive Director Guy Thomas Cosentino.

In recognition of the support of this generous gift the Cayuga Community College Board of Trustees agreed to name the entrance of the planned new Workforce Development Center. The College is undertaking a renovation of the former Cornell Cooperative Extension building on Grant Ave-

nue in Auburn and will name the entrance the "Cayuga County REALTORS ® Welcome Center" when completed next year.

Aaron Lesch of Auburn, who is in his final year at Cayuga was the first recipient of the REALTOR® Scholarship. He told the Foundation that "After my time at CCC, I plan to pursue a bachelor's degree in agricultural business management. As the first recipient of the Cayuga County Realtors Association Scholarship, I am very grateful for this honor."

To be eligible for the Cayuga County REALTOR® Scholarship, students must be enrolled in either of Cayuga's Business Administration programs and attend college full-time. Preferences is given to students with a parent or grandparent who worked in real estate and to a student demonstrating financial need. The recipient is selected by the College's Business faculty.

Cayuga offers students a chance to earn an Associate of Science or an Associate of Applied Sciences in Business Administration. The former degree is primarily designed for students interested in transferring to a four-year baccalaureate program, while the latter is designed for those wishing to enter the workforce after earning their two-year degree. Students pursuing an Associate of Applied Sciences have the option to select concentrations in Entrepreneurship, Sports Management or Wine Studies.



# CAYUGA OPENS ADVANCED MANUFACTURING INSTITUTE ON FULTON CAMPUS

Cayuga Community College formally opened its Fulton Advanced Manufacturing Institute (AMI) on May 5<sup>th</sup>, celebrating a new facility geared toward supporting the current and future workforce as well as regional employers.

Located adjacent to the College’s primary building on the Fulton Campus, the AMI is a 7,800 square foot facility that features industrial power and networking to support training units in pneumatics, hydraulics, motors, piping and industry-grade programmable logic controls stations, and a classroom for instruction.

Available space contiguous to the AMI also presents an opportunity for future development as Cayuga’s manufacturing programs expand. The College already offers several certificate programs that will utilize the facility, and with local industry support is actively researching establishing new degrees to address the skills trades.

Programs available through the AMI will feature flexible, diverse curriculums designed to offer students excellent instruction and training to start their careers. A broad range of stackable certifications and credentials combining workshops, credit and non-credit opportunities and apprenticeships will be available.

Situated on the College’s Fulton Campus, the AMI is designed to support students seeking a degree or certificate, as well as members of the workforce who are looking for short-term training to advance their career or learn a new skill. Credit and non-credit classes started in the AMI in the spring of 2022, with a full semester of classes starting in the fall. “The Advanced Manufacturing Institute will play a pivotal role in preparing the current and future workforce to continue the proud manufacturing tradition in Oswego County and Central New York. At the institute,

“Our Advanced Manufacturing Institute is a unique facility that will support students and the workforce but also employers looking for skilled employees who are ready to contribute on their first day,” said Dr. Keiko Kimura, Cayuga’s Vice President of Workforce Development and Partnerships. “We’re confident students and those seeking short-term training will find the AMI an invaluable resource as they take the next step in their education or career.”



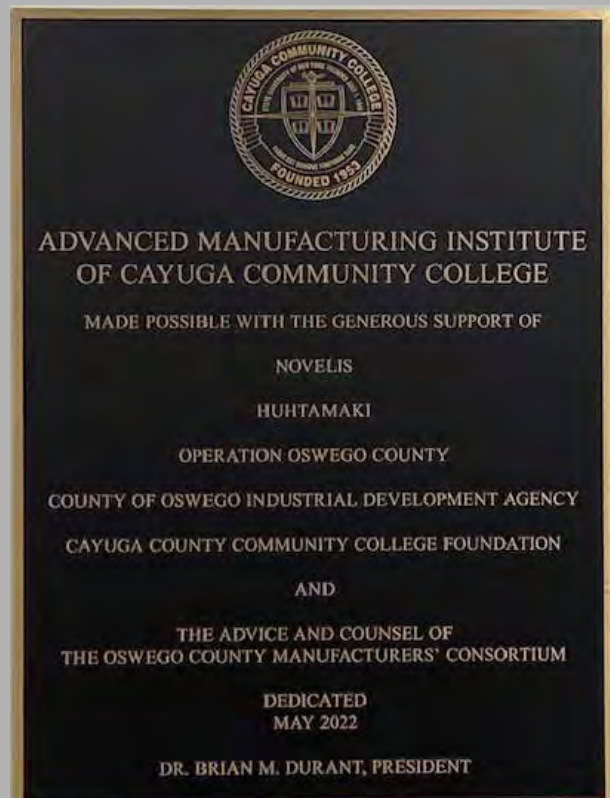

“I credit my teenage daughters, Lola and Layla, for keeping me grounded and giving me purpose,” said Mr. Meyers.

Mr. Meyers was nominated for an Alumni Award by Dr. **Jerimy Blowers '93**, Associate Professor and Wellness Coordinator at CCC. “If there was ever a success story here at Cayuga, this gentleman is it,” said Professor Blowers, a 2019 Alumni Award recipient. “Coming from a challenging past, he had to overcome obstacles that impeded his goals ... and he found the strength that not only helped him survive, but to thrive. He is an instrumental force in our community, helping to guide people to substance abuse recovery.” Mr. Meyers often gives back to the College by sharing his story with students at Cayuga, as well as with school and community groups throughout Cayuga County.

**NICHOLAS VALENTI '66**

Nicholas Valenti graduated from Auburn Community College in 1966 with an Associate in Applied Science in Accounting and continued his education at Niagara University. Prior to that, he served our country as a Marine during the Vietnam War. Since 1979, Mr. Valenti has been involved in local veterans organizations and is currently serving his 10th year as the New York State Central District Director for the Vietnam Veterans of America. County Association of REALTORS that capped this Challenge Grant.

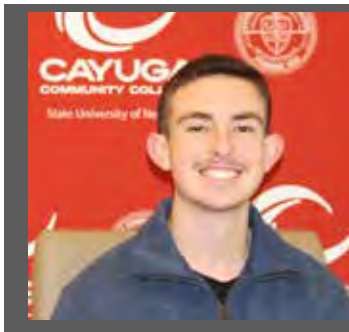

**CAYUGA PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS**

The Cayuga Presidential Scholarship are for outstanding students from high schools in Cayuga and Oswego counties, including private schools. Students from the Jordan-Elbridge, Skaneateles and Red Creek school districts are also eligible. This honor is available to all students who graduate in the top 20% of their high school as long as the student maintains a 3.0 GPA and attends full time. All Cayuga Presidential Scholarship recipients can complete the first two years of their college education without spending a dime in tuition. If their tuition is covered through other sources, they may not receive the Scholarship funding but are still considered Cayuga Presidential Scholars. The Cayuga Presidential Scholarships reward students who participate in honors programs, student government and other leadership positions. These students serve to raise the academic bar in every classroom, serving as examples for their peers.
