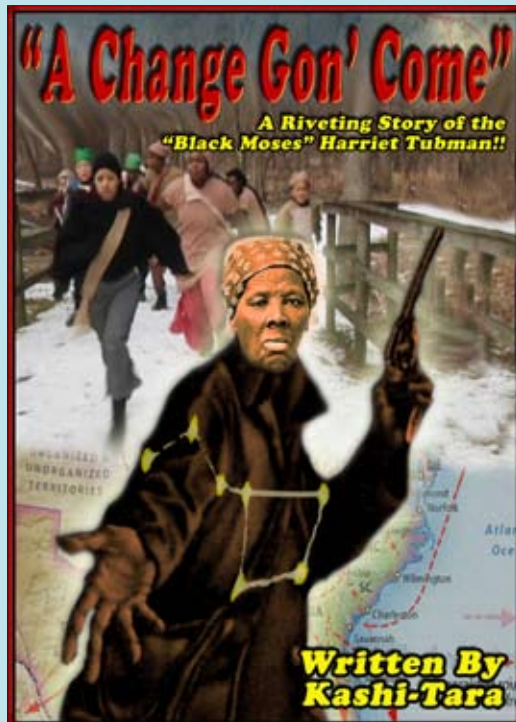

Dear Friends and Supporters:


In 1982 a group of philanthropists and local citizens saw a need: Cayuga Community College was healthy and growing, but it needed that “something extra” to become truly extraordinary. Those civic leaders created the Cayuga Community College Foundation. At its first meeting the Foundation’s financial report listed its total assets: \$1,572.

Three decades later, the CCC Foundation completed its 2013-14 fiscal year with total assets of \$23,288,591. And while it’s satisfying to acknowledge this growth, I like to go a step further and measure our true “bottom line”: changed lives. Thousands of students have completed Cayuga degrees, thanks to the Foundation’s scholarships. Classrooms have been built, faculty have honed their teaching skills through our grants, and students prepare for their futures in laboratories equipped by the CCC Foundation. These accomplishments are a testimonial to the generosity of local foundations, corporations, alumni, faculty, staff and friends. For all this and more, I thank all of you.

Over the past four years, the Foundation has transitioned itself into becoming a partner, not merely a funding source, for Cayuga Community College. We own a significant portion of the buildings and real estate used by the College. We have expanded CCC’s recruitment efforts through our *Cayuga Presidential Scholarships*, which offer full-tuition grants to outstanding students. Our communities benefit from and enjoy the facilities, equipment and cultural programs provided by your support of the CCC Foundation.

As we look to the future, our vision to grow the CCC Foundation continues. Beyond our traditional fund raising campaigns, the Foundation’s growth will depend more and more on alumni and friends who name the CCC Foundation in their estate planning. Support to the College

The Foundation provides support to the College in two forms: 1) scholarships, awards and grants to students and 2) support for academic and other College and community programs. The Foundation had another good year receiving gifts and grants from many generous individuals, foundations and organizations.

Support to Students

In the past year, the Foundation received a bequest from the estate of Mary L. Blodgett to establish the *Dixon G. and Mary L. Blodgett Memorial Scholarships* and approved the creation of the *Cayuga Presidential Scholarships*.

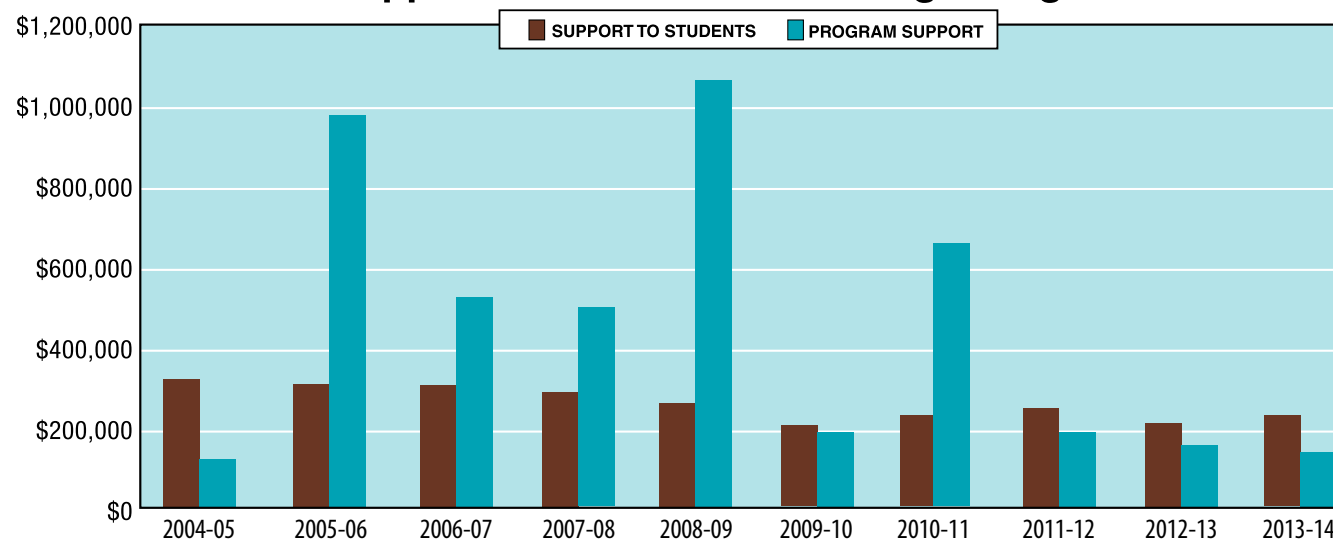
The *Cayuga Presidential Scholarships* are for outstanding students from high schools in Cayuga and Oswego counties, including private schools. Students from the Jordan-Elbridge, Skaneateles and Red Creek school districts are also eligible. These scholarships are available to all students who graduate in the top 20% of their high school class and provide full tuition for two years at CCC, as long as the student maintains a 3.0 GPA and attends full time. All *Cayuga Presidential Scholarship* recipients can complete the first two years of their college education without spending a penny in tuition.

The *Cayuga Presidential Scholarships* reward students for consistently demonstrating strong academic performance. It also will bring students to Cayuga who participate in honors programs, student government and other leadership positions. These students serve to raise the academic bar in every classroom, serving as examples for their peers.

During 2013-14, the Foundation provided \$387,771 to the College and to the community through awards, scholarships, campus improvements and other awards including the following:

- \$253,697 for 249 **Scholarships** and 78 **Commencement Awards** to diminish some of the unmet need of \$17,115,502 for 2013-2014.
- \$20,071 in **Faculty Grants** for the **Emerson Endowed Chair** and three **Special Project Grants**.
- Generous donations were received from foundations, including the D. E. French, Columbian and the Stanley W. Metcalf Foundations. Additional support came from alumni, faculty, staff, businesses, organizations, trusts, friends and memorial gifts.

Support to the College

Program Support

During 2013-14 the CCC Foundation provided significant program funding. Foundation grants give CCC faculty the new tools they need to provide updated, cutting-edge educational programming for our students. Here is a sampling of Foundation-funded initiatives in the past year.

The **Instructional Equipment Fund** provided support for:

- Physics equipment for the Fulton Campus
- Spectrophotometers for the chemistry lab on the Auburn Campus
- New treadmills for the Fitness Center
- Nursing iPads plus licenses for the nursing program and a hospital bed
- A projector, lens, audio controls and programming for the Bisgrove Theatre and the Theatre Arts.

The **Library Collection Fund** of the CCC Foundation purchased eBooks to add to the library's circulation, which included *Encyclopedia of Everyday Law* and *Scholarship, Fellowships, and Loans*.

Special Projects and Development Grants provide faculty and staff members the opportunity to attend conferences, explore possible new programs and develop new intersession courses.

- **Melissa Johnson**, Assistant Professor of Art, participated in the *SUNY Adirondack Leadership Challenge* at SUNY ESF's Newcomb Campus. This intensive and highly interactive program combined the challenging wilderness environment of the Adirondacks with leadership development.
- **Linda Alfieri**, Professor, Director of Nursing, attended the *Nuts & Bolts for Nurse Educators* Conference in Minneapolis, Minnesota. The seminar was designed to provide evidence-based strategies to facilitate teaching and learning.
- **Brenda Forrest**, Professor of Nursing, attended the National League for Nursing workshop, *Taking the Angst Out of Test Construction and Item Analysis*, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This workshop offered practical guidelines and tools for item construction, determining the cognitive level of items, test blueprint construction, item analysis, linguistic modification, and much more. The latest news on the changes with NCLEX style questions and how to prepare our nursing students to be successful on that exam was also shared.

CCC Foundation Supports Nature Trail Upgrades

The Nature Trail on CCC's Auburn Campus has been called "a small, natural oasis in an urban area." Two grants secured by CCC Assistant Professor Sheila Myers helped fund improvements on the trail in 2013-14.

When Auburn Community College moved to Franklin Street in 1959, the Nature Trail area was farmland. Hikers on the trail can still see barbed wire fencing, hedgerows and stands of apple trees. Man-made ponds and trails were added in 1978. Through the years, the late Ruth Sara Goldman was a regular fixture on the trail. Her family purchased exercise equipment and benches for the trail that were dedicated in her honor in 2009.

The trail has long been used by classes on natural resource management, ecology and botany. CCC Professor Tom Casella manages the trail and takes his students to the trail for inspiration for their art. Associate Professor Paul Richardson engages students, faculty and staff every spring on bird identification tours.

European Buckthorn, Japanese Knotweed and other invasive species gradually claimed large sections of the trail. In 2013 Assistant Professor Myers enlisted biology students to conduct service-learning projects to improve the trail ecosystem. Based on their

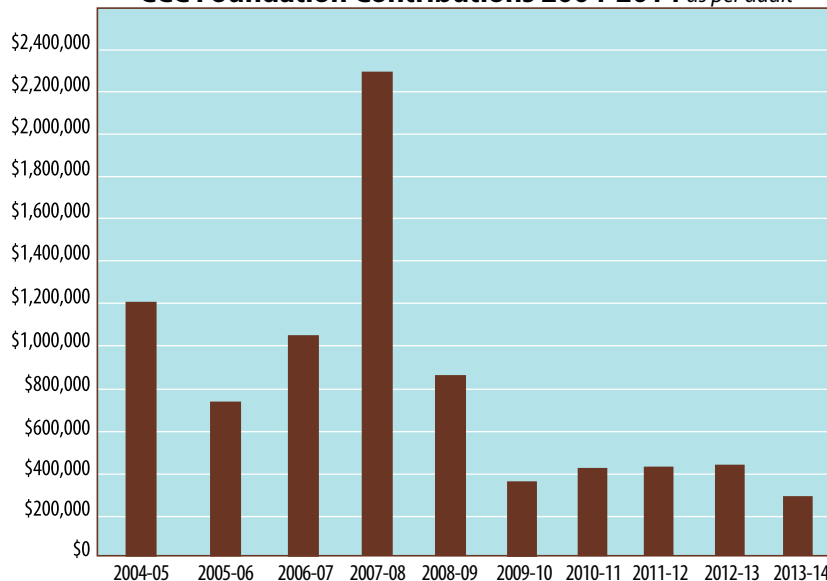
research, Myers secured grants from the Dorr Foundation of New Hampshire and a "Creating Healthy Places to Live, Work and Play Grant" through the Cayuga County Health Department. Great quantities of buckthorn were replaced with indigenous Red Maple, Poplar and Swamp White Oaks, and new signage and equipment will be added in 2015.

Renovations to CCC's Nature Trail are a team effort. The CCC Foundation administered all grants and gifts for the trail. CCC students, who are also our future alumni, have rolled up their sleeves, literally and figuratively, to keep our "natural oasis" a place to enjoy for years to come. 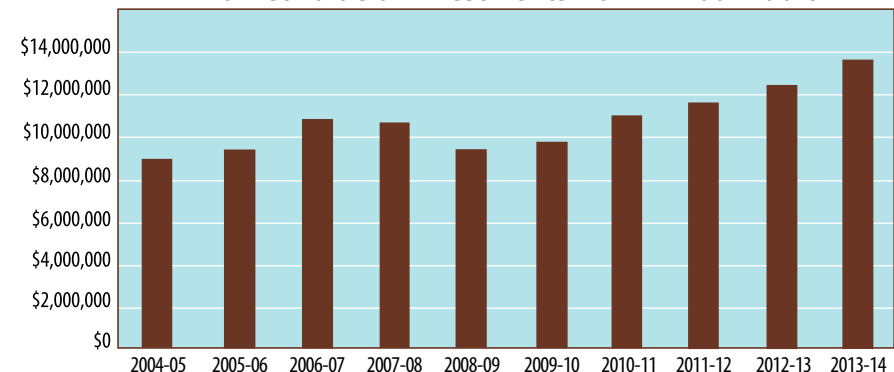


Professor Tom Casella assists students Stacy Denman and Javanna Mathews in planting a Red Maple on the Nature Trail.

“A Change Gon’ Come”

In partnership with the Harriet Tubman Boosters Club, the CCC Foundation brought The Finest! Performance Foundation, a theatrical group from Maryland, to the Irene A. Bisgrove Community Theatre for their moving performance of “A Change Gon’ Come,” a stage production based on the life of Harriet Tubman. In two heart-pounding acts, this original production explored the history of the African-American people through the eyes of one of our most awe-inspiring Americans. The audience was transported to the front lines of unrelenting circumstances and choices that Harriet Tubman and every other slave had to make if they were to escape to freedom. A re-imagined journey of enchantment, love, agony, dignity and triumph, every scene dramatically exposed the emotional fullness of the violent, inhumane treatment of slaves and the intricacies of relationships and family. Through Harriet’s story we experienced the yearning for a better tomorrow, the fear of death and the unyielding promise of freedom!

Rosemarie Romano, Co-Chair of the Harriet Tubman Centennial Symposium and Harriet Tubman Boosters Club shared these comments following the production: “Thank you for bringing this wonderful performance to Auburn and freely offering it to the community. It was the perfect kickoff to the Harriet Tubman Centennial Symposium, and for those who were not able to afford, or interested in attending, the more scholarly programs that we presented during the day, a perfect culmination to this yearlong celebration. By bringing Harriet Tubman to life, it helped to reveal the real woman behind the icon and the real courage and self-sacrifice it took for her to escape and rescue others from the system of slavery, the brutality of which was so dramatically illustrated in this production. From the reactions of the audience on Thursday night, it was clear that they were moved. I have always believed that the arts—music, dance, poetry—are often the most powerful way of communicating ideas and helping us to understand and connect with each other. Thank you so much for recognizing this and helping us to achieve our goal in such an entertaining and engaging way!”



Fulton Welcome Center named for Sue Witmer

Susan C. Witmer '90 has been a presence at CCC-Fulton since its very beginning in 1994. In 2014 Sue decided to associate her name with the campus in perpetuity through the *Susan C. Witmer Welcome Center* at the Fulton Campus.

In 2006, Fulton earned SUNY recognition as a Branch Campus. Six years later, CCC moved to its campus to River Glen Plaza. It was in 2012 that the CCC Foundation expanded its fund raising in Oswego County. “River Glen is CCC’s permanent home in Oswego County, and we want local people to take ownership in our campus,” said Executive Director Jeff Hoffman. The College’s employees pitched in by donating more than \$20,400 for the

Fulton Campus. Sue Witmer stepped forward, making the largest employee donation to the campaign. The Board of Trustees recognized her generosity in the naming of Fulton’s *Welcome Center*.

Reflecting on her career at Cayuga, Sue noted that “CCC has been a major portion of my life for over 32 years. I’m the last of the original Fulton employees; it’s been like watching a child grow into a young adult this past 20 years. Knowing that I’ve played a leading role in the success of the Fulton Campus makes me proud.”

As to her reasons for giving, Sue explained “My high regard for the institution and my passion and dedication to the Fulton Campus are evident by my energy and work ethic on a daily basis. I have made lifelong friendships with staff and students and regard the Fulton Campus as my family. The partnerships we’ve developed demonstrate that Cayuga is THE community college for Oswego County. I’m proud to say that I have been an integral part of Fulton’s past, present and future.”

CCC Earns National Recognition for Entrepreneurship Education

2013-14 marked a transitional year for the College's work in Entrepreneurial Studies, supported by the CCC Foundation. Professor Tom Paczkowski '72, our *Emerson Endowed Chair* since its inception, shared this position with John Liddy of the Syracuse Tech Garden. Paczkowski continued to coordinate our work with faculty, staff, student clubs and Cayuga-Onondaga BOCES. Mr. Liddy gave us a fresh "outsider's view" of CCC's e-ship efforts.

Professor Paczkowski earned the *Leavey Award for Excellence in Private Enterprise Education* from *Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge* for his work on entrepreneurship. He was one of only eight people from across the U.S. to receive this award. The *Freedoms Foundation* noted that his work "is a significant step helping to ignite the spirit of freedom and entrepreneurship at community colleges across the land."

CCC Professor Amy Valente served as a consultant for e-ship programs through NACCE, the National Association for Community College Entrepreneurship. Both Ms. Valente and CCC's co-Endowed Chair John Liddy were honored 2013-14 NACCE Fellows.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITIES: Something to Think About in 2015

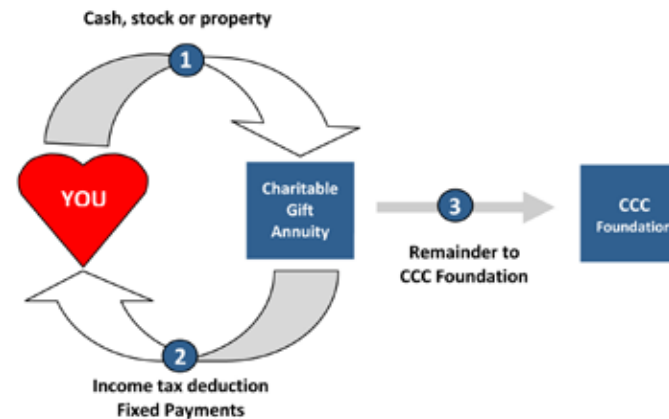
Earning a reliable income from your investment portfolio can be a real challenge. The stock market continued to fluctuate in 2014. Secure investments such as CDs offer a safer alternative if you are willing to sign a long-term commitment for an annual return of less than 1%.

In this market, the CCC Foundation can offer you an option that provides both a safe investment and a good rate of return. It's called a **Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA)** and here's how it works:

Step One: The donor transfers cash, stocks or property to the CCC Foundation.

Step Two: The CCC Foundation confirms your income tax deduction and possible savings in capital gains tax. You then receive fixed payments to you or to anyone you name, for life. Often, a portion of these payments is tax free. The IRS allows for generous annual rates on CGAs, which can reach 6%, 7% or more annually.

Step Three: When the CGA ends, the remaining principal goes to the CCC Foundation.



Using assets that have increased in value may provide you with additional benefits. Let's say you bought stock in "Company XYZ" back in 1995 at a cost basis of \$10,000. Today, that stock is worth \$50,000. If you sell it, you'll pay tax on \$40,000 in capital gains. However, if you transfer the stock to the CCC Foundation into a CGA, you will 1) avoid the capital gains tax; 2) take a \$50,000 tax deduction; and 3) receive fixed, quarterly payments...**guaranteed**...for your lifetime. A CGA benefits you for years to come and leaves a legacy for Cayuga's future students.

The CCC Foundation can give you examples of CGAs based on your age and/or the age of your spouse (CGAs can benefit two people, not just one). Robert W. Pine '74 Creates Family Legacy at Cayuga Community College

Most successful people have one thing in common: they enjoy sharing their success with others. Robert W. Pine '74, CPA, decided to use his success to create a permanent legacy for CCC's students by endowing the *Joseph W. and Margaret G. Pine Memorial Scholarship* in 2007. In 2014, Bob Pine decided to add to his scholarship fund by naming the CCC Foundation in his will. Going forward the fund will be renamed the Pine Family Memorial Scholarship.

"ACC was the perfect place for me to start after high school," Pine remembered. "The faculty at Auburn Community College gave me the background in accounting that I needed to go onto St. Bonaventure." Pine began his public accounting career with Ernst and Ernst in Syracuse. "I had some great instructors, especially professors Camardo, Richardson, O'Donovan, Griffin and Lovell. From there, I returned to Auburn and started my own accounting firm which was sold in 1995." Pine pursued a new career in Cable television construction industry and ultimately sold the Company in 2002 to the largest Hispanic publicly traded Company in the USA.

Presently Pine owns and operates R.W.P. Investments, through which he serves clients in a variety of financial consulting services from Florida to New York. His twin daughters Taylor and Chelsea both graduated from the College's Nursing Program.

Bob Pine's support for his alma mater goes far beyond his philanthropy. Bob joined the CCC Foundation's Board of Directors, serving one term from 1989 to 1992 and additional terms from 2001 to 2009. He served as Board President from 2004 to 2006 and from January to June 2009. He also has served on the College's Board of Trustees.

"Auburn is my home, and I want to help young Auburnians write their own success stories at CCC. The College has done so much for me, my family and the community; that's why I've decided to give back." Additionally Pine was instrumental in creating the Kenneth and Margaret Lesch Jahn Memorial Scholarship in 1994.

The Pine Family Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a returning student in their second year of the nursing program. First preference is given to a single parent who is an Auburn High School graduate and who demonstrates financial need.

"Gifts like this represent philanthropy at its highest level," said Jeff Hoffman, executive director of the CCC Foundation.
