Thirty years ago, the Auburn Community College/Cayuga Community College Alumni Association created an award to recognize the achievements of alums that have made and continue to make a difference in our community, nation and world.

The Alumni Association recognized its 2023 nominees this Summer at a reception and awards ceremony held at Prison City North in Auburn and was attended by the nominees, their nominators, families and friends.

Alumni Board President and Foundation Board Member, **Amanda Stankus '03**, told those in attendance "It is fascinating to learn about the myriad of paths Cayuga graduates have taken and how they are working to build a better community."

James Van Arsdale '06 returned to col lege after a 20 year career in the business field that included owning a Domino's Pizza franchise. He earned his Bache lors in Educational Science in 2008 from SUNY Oswego and completed his Mas ters in the Integration of Technology in the Classroom through Walden Univer sity in 2012. He has been an elementary teacher at the Moravia Central School District for more than 15 years. **Patrick Crawford '96** earned his BS in Biology from SUNY Geneseo and MS in Education from SUNY Oswego. He has taught at the Auburn Enlarged School District since 1999. In 2018, Mr. Crawford was selected as the Ca yuga Onondaga School Board Asso ciation's Teacher of the Year. He was also selected as the New York State Master Teacher for the Central New Region **Darryl Clark '01** who went on to Duquesne University to play Division 1 Football and Track while obtaining his Bachelor's degree in Multi-Media Arts. He traveled to Germany to play semi-pro football before returning to Auburn. Mr. Clark has built several studios from the ground up, including AVP Unlimited, an audio, video and photography production facility in Au burn.

"This year's group of inductees are all the more special, be cause weaving throughout the Class of 2023 are three people who have made it part of their mission to work with young people and just as importantly raising funds for local charities, whether it comes to helping those in need, youth programing or the arts – what a great and noble group" said Foundation Board President John Latanyshyn." A MESSAGE FROM THE FOUNDATION

In the Foundation's offices we have a collection of yearbooks that were produced from the inception of Auburn Community College in 1953, 70 years ago, into the 1980's, when we evolved into Cayuga Community College.

The College's first yearbook, in 1955, has the picture below of the original Board that contains several names familiar with the College's history (including Boyle, Goldman, Karpinski and LoCastro). A short history reports that in 1951, the New York State Legislature created the law to allow for ten cities as "sites for new centers for colleges".



It ends with a comment that "The trustees of ACC were appointed in 1953, four by the Governor and five by the City of Auburn. In the Fall of 1953 ACC became a reality with the entrance of the first freshman class."

Since then, ACC has grown into Cayuga Community College with both Auburn and Fulton campuses and expanded into workforce development programs that include advanced manufacturing, culinary arts and law enforcement. The Foundation Board at its November Board meeting authorized a gift of \$215,000 to the College that will be matched by SUNY for the College to complete the new Law Enforcement Academy in Fulton in 2024.

As we celebrate the College's 70th birthday this year the College Foundation's 2023-2024 Annual Campaign is focused on raising funds to help our students in degree and non-degree programs. A decade ago, the College was evenly split between full and part-time students. With changes in demographics, the economy and, yes, the aftermath of COVID-19, our campus make-up has shifted, to almost 60% of our students being part time.

The College and Foundation have found that with that shift, there is a higher need among our students for emergency assistance when it comes to food security, health care, housing and transportation. With that in mind we are again focusing on the emergency needs of our students.

We are asking friends of our students and of the College to make a gift of \$70 to mark the College's 70th birthday that will be used to assist students with unforeseen emergencies that College Staff feel the Fund can help with on a one time basis.

Donors to the \$70 for 70 Campaign will be listed in the Foundation's Annual Report and in a future issue of *The Spartan*.
